1. Purpose and Scope

1.1. Scope

1.2. Purpose:

The purpose is to create sentencing reference documents using the Global Justice XML Data Model (GJXDM). The IEPD is intended to act as a guide or template for local jurisdictions implementing electronic exchange of information, in this case, sentencing order information. It is expected that jurisdictions that implement the exchange will extend and/or constrain the IEPD to fit their individual needs. Ultimately, as the result of the experience gained through local implementations, the IEPD will be revised with the goal of moving toward a single standardized exchange.

The purpose of developing any IEPD is to achieve the following:

- Facilitate information sharing within the court community and between courts and other justice partners.
- Facilitate the development of consistent and reusable court data components.
- Reduce costs and increase efficiency of information sharing efforts.
- Establish court information sharing policies and procedures.
- Foster collaborative development between the courts and other justice domains.
- Create a common understanding and language between domain experts and technical experts.

4.1.1 Document

Name	Description
Sentencing Order	This sentencing model provides a data and relationship framework for information exchange based on the court's determination and order concerning a specific criminal case defendant charged with a crime. The outcome message includes information related to the participants, charges, findings, and consequences.

4.1.2 Document Sections

Assigned Attorney	The attorney who will prosecute the case in court.
Authorizing Person	A government official employed by a court,

Court Charge Disposition	Details about a punishment resulting from conviction of charges in a court case.

Order	An order issued by a court requiring a person to do or not to do something.
Prosecutors Office	Office that is prosecuting the criminal case and representing the government.

Subject	The person or organization of interest.
Supervising Agency	The criminal justice agency who has authority over the person.

Additional Sanctions	Sanctions that are in addition to the charge penalties and may be ordered either by the court or another agency (e.g. sex offender registration, mandatory DNA collection, HIV testing, license revocation, license revocation hearing, State Concealed Weapon Hearing, Post-Release Supervision, Ignition Lock Device)
Address	Text description of the location of a person or organization
Agency Identifiers	An administrative division of a government.
Alias	An assumed name (referred to in law enforcement as an "Also Known As" or AKA
Body	Body text in a document.
Business Address	A location of an organization.
Charge Modifier	Statute that qualifies the charge (e.g. conspiracy, attempted, solicitation, party to crime)
Charge Penalty	Penalties relating to either fines or detention/imprisonment.
Community Service	Work performed by law offenders to serve a sentence in lieu of or in addition to jail time
Contact	Text and numeric information about the person who is the contact person for the data being submitted.

Court Case Identifiers	Reference numbers or other identifying information regarding a court case.
Court Identifiers	Reference numbers or other identifying information regarding a court.
Deferred Term	Period of time that a sentence is delayed to provide the opportunity for a sentenced person for any number of reasons including pending the outcome of appeal, to get their affairs in order, etc. May be referred to as a Stayed Sentence.
Dismissal	An order or notice of discharge.
Drivers License	Official motor vehicle operators license issued by a state or legislatively authorized government organization.
Effective Dates	The effective dates for a court order, warrant, or sentence.
Enhancer	Anything that enhances the penalty of the underlying crime. Examples include crime committed within 1000 feet of a school, committed with a gun, gang violence.
Incarceration Term	Details regarding a period of time that is assigned to a person to serve in confinement.
Jurisdiction	The legal authority of a court.
Justice Person Identifiers	Badge number, bar number and employment name for Affiant for the Arrest Warrant.
Legal Authority for Offense	The underlying substantive offense
Name	The name of the person.
Obligation Details	An obligation to pay money to the court, government, or another party.
Person Identifiers	Identifying numbers such as social security number, law enforcement officer badge number, or FBI or state criminal ID number.
Physical Characteristics	Identify scars, marks, tatoos and other distinguishing physical characteristics. This can include missing limbs, large ears, etc.
Physical Descriptors	The physical description of a person.
Plea	An accused party's answer to a criminal charge or indictment.
Previous Case Identifiers	Identifiers for previous cases for the defendant or group of defendants.
Probation	A convicted person who has received a suspended sentence for conviction of a criminal offense that has been granted provisional freedom on the promise of good behavior and following the guidelines set forth by the court.
Recipient Organization	An organization to whom a payment obligation must be fulfilled.
Recipient Person	A person to whom a payment obligation must be fulfilled.
Related Case Identifiers	Identifiers for concurrent or previously related court cases not caused by the incident in question.

Residential Address	Details about an address for a place where a person lives.
Sentence Credit	The positive amount of time applied to a person's sentence of incarceration or probation.
Sentence Description	Details of the criminal sentence.
Sentence Relationships	How a sentence is associated to the sentence in another charge within the same case and how that sentence impacts this sentence. This relationship may be established to charges in another case. Relationships may be established for any sentence type including incarceration, probation, etc. For example, a judge may order a sentence to be served concurrently or consecutively or forthwith (supercedes other sentences).
Social Details	Information regarding a persons citizenship and military service status.
Suspended Term	Describes the period for which the execution of a sentence is delayed or canceled pending the outcome of an alternative form of punishment or fulfillment of specified conditions.
Verdict	The finding of a judge or jury in a trial.
Verification	Mechanism for validation of subject. This may include fingerprinting, etc.
Work Address	Address of an employer

4.1.4 Elements

Name	Description
Advisory Notification Agency	Agency(s) that the court must advise additional outside agencies of the outcome (e.g. notify DMV of a DUI conviction that may lead to drivers license revocation)
Age At Incident Description	Age of the alleged person at time of the incident. This element should also allow for an approximate age if specific date of birth is not known.
Agency Code Identifier	An alphanumeric code used and assigned locally to agencies to uniquely identify them within that jurisdiction.
Agency Name	Name of a justice agency, e.g. police department, law firm, court.
Agency ORI	A unique identifier assigned to a justice-related organization by the federal government. Sometimes referred to as ORI, ORI code, Originating Agency Code.
Agency Reporting District	Name of a work group or area in a local office
Alternative Charge Indicator	If this is a charge that offers an alternative to the primary charge, set to True. It is a second charge on the same count.

Amended Sentence Case Number	Docket number of the previous case if an existing sentence is being amended.
Amended Sentence Description	Describes why the order has been amended. Examples include violation of probation, changed disposition, or when a judge revises and revokes a previous order.
Area Code	A dialing code for a state or province for phone numbers in the USA, Canada, Mexico, and the Caribbean.
Bar Number	The defense attorney's unique identifier. assigned by a state or bar association to an attorney authorized to practice law.
Branch	Name of the branch of a court with facilities in multiple locations.
Building Designation	A number or letters assigned to identify a building in an address.
CDL Status Code	Indicates the current status of a Commercial Drivers License (e.g. suspended, expired)
Case Caption	Official case title for court record.
Case Category	For trial courts, there are five case categories, representing the highest level of classification: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> · Civil · Domestic Relations · Criminal · Juvenile · Traffic, Parking, & Local Ordinance Violations
Case Reference	References a case number.
Case Tracking Number	Number used to track a case through the system. Live Scan may generate this number. If the person has not been printed the court may assign number and provide number to law enforcement.
Charge Attribute	Additional information that notifies the court of special conditions (e.g. domestic violence, white collar crime, or court reporting requirements)
Charge Count Number	Number assigned within a case to an individual charge to identify it for sentencing reporting purposes.
Charge Description	Statutory text describing the offense committed by the defendant and how it applies to the cited statute.
Charge Modifier Description	Phrase or word that qualifies the charge (e.g. conspiracy, attempted, solicitation, party to crime)
Charge Reference	Details about a formal allegation that a specific person has committed a specific offense.
Charge Text	A narrative description of the facts and circumstances for which a statute is charged. In the event of a correctable offense, this may include text that describes the equipment (tail light, headlight, etc.) that requires fixing; if fixed, citation is dismissed

Charge Title	A summary heading of a crime or offense.
Charge Type	Severity of the charge (e.g., infraction, misdemeanor, felony).
Citizenship	Code or text indicating a country of citizenship.
Community Service Description	Description of the time and duties the defendant is sentenced to relating to a community service consequence.
Community Service Type	A code or indicator for type of community service a defendant is sentenced to perform.
Count Number	A unique identifying number assigned to a particular charge by an arresting agency, prosecuting attorney, or a court for case management purposes.
Country Code	An international dialing code for a country.
Country Name	Name of the country
County Name	The name of the County governmental unit.
Court Case Number	A unique identifier assigned to a court case.
Court ID	An identifier of an organization based on the type of organization it is, e.g., for a court, this would be a court identifier.
Court Name	Official name of the court.
Court ORI	A unique identifier assigned by the federal government to a court as a participating criminal justice agency.
Court Type	Type or level of court that has jurisdiction, e.g., county court, municipal court, superior court

Deferred Description	Code or other indicator for deferred sentence.
Digital Image	A photograph rendered into digital format
Digital Verifier	Digital representation of an photograph, fingerprint, or biometric.
Digital Verifier Type	Text describing the type of verification (e.g. fingerprint, image, biometric)
Dismissal Code	A code indicating the reason for the case to be dismissed.
Dismissal Description	Text description of the reason the case was dismissed.
District	Name or identifier of a judicial district within a court system.
Division	A sub-unit of a court responsible for a particular area of law or legal matters (e.g., criminal, juvenile, civil, traffic).
Due Date	The due date for a financial obligation.
Duration Hours	A specific range or duration of a term.
Email Address	An email address of a person or organization.
Employment Position Name	A title related to a person's profession (e.g. District Attorney, Sheriff, Judge).
Endorsement Code	Indicates the driver's authority to drive specific

Federal DOT Number	Number assigned by DOT to an organization

Floor	The floor number of a particular building
Hair Color Code	A code representing person's hair color.
Height Measure	A person's height.
Incarceration Location	A description of the incarceration location ordered by the court. For example: DOC, local jail, mental hospital, work camp, weekend jail, state prison.
Incarceration Type	A code or description indicating the type of incarceration (e.g. Term, Execution, Life Without Parole, Life With Parole)
Inmate Identifier	A person-based number assigned by Department of Corrections. This may include an inmate locator identifier.
Interpreter Required Indicator	Set to yes if a person needs an interpreter.
Issue Date	Date an order was issued.
Issue Time	Time of day an order was issued.
Issuing Country	If an International Drivers License, indicates the country that a person has a valid drivers' license in.
Judicial Officer Identifier	A number that is assigned to judicial personnel.
Last Name	Last name of a person.
License Class Code	A code indicating the types of vehicles a person is licensed to operate (e.g. commercial, private)
License Commercial Class Code	A code identifying the size of commercial vehicle (e.g. A, B, C) that a licensed driver has been examined on and approved to operate.
License Issuing Jurisdiction	The state or other authorization (e.g. DOD) from which a driver's license was issued.
License Number	Unique identifier assigned by the state to a driver's license.
License Restriction Code	A code indicating any constraints or restrictions on a person's authorization to operate a motor

Local Person Identifier	A unique number assigned to a defendant by a local law enforcement agency based on submitted fingerprints or other less precise methods.
Location Description	Captures all information to identify a location. May represent street address and city, direction of travel, mile markers, cross roads, location on body, etc.
Mark Type	The type of physical feature (e.g. tattoo, scar, mole)
Maximum Duration	A maximum range or duration for a term.
Middle Name	Middle name of a person.
Military Indicator	Indicates if a person is currently on active duty in the military
Military Status	The military status of a person (active, AWOL, discharged).
Minimum Duration	A minimum range or duration for a term.
Moniker	Nickname or alternative justice identifier.
Municipality Name	Name of a city, township, etc.
NCIC Charge Code	The NCIC code assigned to the criminal case charge.
Name Prefix	A title or honorific used by a person, e.g., Dr., Judge, General, Ms.
Name Suffix	A component that is appended after the family name that distinguishes members of a family with the same given, middle, and last name, (e.g., Jr, Sr, III), or otherwise qualifies the name (e.g., MD, LLD, PhD).
Narrative	Text describing details of an order or incident.
Obligation Type	The type of financial obligation ordered by the court (fine, restitution, surcharge).

4.2. Process:

In March, 2004 the COSCA/NACM Joint Technology Committee was asked to choose from a list of common inter-agency and inter-departmental justice messages and rank the most commonly used court forms and communications. The top four selections were citation, protection order, sentence, and warrant documents. Because these are the most common forms used by courts and therefore, the most common communication data exchanges, these four selections have served as the basis of the initial IEPD work performed by the National Center for State Courts.

A key element of the project was to establish a court Joint Standards Development (JSD) Team to participate in the development of the IEPD. The JSD team included participants from the courts, prosecutors, SEARCH and the justice industry. (See Section 6.1)

The first step in the creation of reference documents is to solicit court forms and electronic data exchanges from State Court IT Directors. In late May and early June, 2004, an updated listing of State Court IT Directors was completed and an e-mail was sent soliciting forms and electronic messages already used by courts for traffic and misdemeanor citation and domestic violence protection orders. The following states sent information for sentencing documents:

Once the forms and other data transmission source documents were collected, both NCSC and contract staff extracted the data elements from the forms and organized them by state and then grouped them by like element. After performing the first analysis, and based on input from other GJXDM related meetings, it was determined that it would benefit all to create a data relationship model, or domain model, so as to better understand the organization, relationships and groupings of data involved in the exchange. The domain model is a pictorial representation from the business perspective of the groupings, Sections, Components and Elements, that make up the exchange.

A JSD meetings was held for developing the Sentencing Order IEPD in Chicago, Illinois on August 24, 2004. During the meetings participants were asked to review the proposed domain model to determine: the appropriateness of the groupings, the need for each of the elements within the groupings, and the need for additional elements not present.

Following the JSD meetings URL Integration, a sub-contractor to the NCSC, used their excellent data mapping and organization software to map the elements to the GJXDM and to define and associate new extension elements where needed.

Subsequent follow-up work was conducted through WebEx conference calls with the JSD team. This included vetting the resulting domain model, vetting the descriptions and definitions of both GJXDM and extension elements for appropriateness, and reviewing the final IEPD once generated.
