Available Relief	 No threats to commit or committing acts of abuse No harassing, stalking, annoying, threatening, or engaging in conduct that would place protected parties in reasonable fear of bodily injury No verbal/written contact (either in person, telephonically, electronically, or in any other manner, either directly or indirectly through a third person) No physical or violent contact with protected parties or their property Stay away (minimum of 300 ft of home or other specified place) Temporary custody of children Temporary possession of home/vehicle 	In addition to relief provided by an ex parte order: • More long-term custody/visitation of children • Possession of home/vehicle • Attorney fees/other support for protected parties











Protected Parties	 A person who is at least 18 years old or is otherwise emancipated A parent, legal guardian, next friend, court-appointed guardian ad litem, or the State Department of Human Resources may petition for relief on behalf of a minor child or person with physical or mental incapacity Minors/children of the victim Other person designated by the court
Requirements for Service	 Notice of hearing/protection order: Plaintiff: Within 24 hours Defendant: As soon as possible (with petition) Law Enforcement: Within 24 hours Protective Order Registry: Courts enter within 24 hours Law Enforcement Tactical System: Law Enforcement enter within 24 hours National Crime Information Center: Law Enforcement enter within 24 hours Proof of Service: Protective Order Registry: Courts enter within 24 hours Law Enforcement Tactical System: Law Enforcement enter within 24 hours National Crime Information Center: Law Enforcement enter within 24 hours

1 Courts should not charge a victim of domestic violence, dating violence, stalking, or sexual assault any costs associated with the filing, issuance, registration, or service of protection orders, whether issued by civil or criminal courts, including intra- and inter-jurisdictional orders. This no-cost provision also applies to any fees or costs associated with a criminal matter related to domestic violence, stalking, dating violence, and sexual assault (42 U.S.C. § 3796 hh(c)(4)). Charging any of these costs will render a jurisdiction ineligible for certain VAWA funds.
