Terminology	Emergency Protective Order Temporary Restraining Order	Long-Term Restraining Order	
Length of Order	Emergency Order: Five court business days or seven calendar days, whichever is earlier.	Up to 5 years for the initial long- term restraining order.	
	Temporary Order: Up to 25 days after filing the petition, and as extended by court.	Long-term restraining order may be renewed for five years or more, or made permanent.	
Available Relief	<ul> <li>Order the restrained party to:         <ul> <li>Refrain from molesting, attacking, striking, stalking, threatening, sexually assaulting, battering, disturbing the peace of protected persons (note that disturbing the peace includes coercive control and reproductive coercion)</li> </ul> </li> <li>Refrain from credibly impersonating or falsely personating protected persons</li> <li>Refrain from harassing, telephoning, or contacting protected persons, either directly or indirectly, by mail or otherwise.</li> <li>Refrain from destroying personal property of protected persons</li> <li>Refrain from coming within a specified distance of protected persons, their homes, workplaces, schools, cars, or other locations</li> </ul>	In addition to relief provided by an emergency or temporary order:  Order the restrained party to: Refrain from owning, possessing, purchasing, receiving or attempting to own, possess, purchase, or receive firearms or ammunition Pay spousal/child support, attorney fees, court costs, or other expenses associated with the abuse or bringing this matter to the court Participate in a batterer's program

Available Relief (cont'd)	<ul> <li>Refrain from cashing, borrowing against, canceling, transferring, disposing of, or changing the beneficiaries of any insurance or other coverage</li> <li>Stay away from the animal and forbid the respondent from taking, transferring, encumbering, concealing, molesting, attacking, striking, threatening, harming, or otherwise disposing of the animal</li> <li>Grant the petitioner:         <ul> <li>Possession of the residence</li> <li>Possession of pets or companion animals</li> </ul> </li> <li>The court may also:         <ul> <li>Order temporary custody/visitation rights</li> <li>Temporary possession of real and personal property</li> <li>Other relief</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	The court may also order:  Child support and spousal support  Debt payment  Complete batterer intervention program  Order wireless telephone provider to transfer telephone numbers and billing authority  Other relief	
Protected Party <sup>1</sup> (person requesting restraining order)	<ul> <li>Current or former spouse/domestic partner</li> <li>Have child in common</li> <li>Currently or formerly in a dating or engagement relationship</li> <li>Children, parents, siblings, grandparents (related by consanguinity or affinity within the second degree)</li> <li>Current or former cohabitants (more than just roommates)</li> </ul>		
Requirements for Service	<ul> <li>Law enforcement will serve the emergency order on the restrained party.</li> <li>The petitioner must have the restrained party personally served. Sheriff's office will serve for free, if requested.</li> <li>If the petitioner is unable to serve the order, the court may permit an alternative method of service, including publication and posting</li> </ul>		

<sup>1</sup> The person requesting a restraining order may also request that family or household members be protected by the restraining order.

2 Courts should not charge a victim of domestic violence, dating violence, stalking, or sexual assault any costs associated with the filing, issuance, registration, or service of protection orders, whether issued by civil or criminal courts, including intra- and inter-jurisdictional orders. This no-cost provision also applies to any fees or costs associated with a criminal matter related to domestic violence, stalking, dating violence, and sexual assault (42 U.S.C. § 3796 hh(c)(4)). Charging any of these costs will render a jurisdiction ineligible for certain VAWA funds.
