JoAnne Page has over 40 years experience in criminal justice, with the last 25 of those years at the helm of The Fortune Society. Fortune has been recognized as a pioneer in assisting former prisoners to reintegrate into society, offering more than a dozen programs including mental health and substance abuse treatment, counseling, family services, HIV/AIDS health services, employment services, housing and alternatives to incarceration. Under Ms. Page's stewardship, The Fortune Society opened the Fortune Academy in 2002, a residence housing men and women who have been released from prison into homelessness, which has received national recognition. In 2009, Fortune broke ground on a green, certified LEEDS Gold supportive and affordable housing development with 114 units and 20,000 sq. ft. of service space, with tenants moving in August 2010. A graduate of Yale Law School, JoAnne Page is a frequent speaker at conferences about criminal justice programs and issues.
